New Mexico Livestock Board Rules For Transporting Horses to the Roosevelt County Fair Youth Horse Show

- Proof of ownership for in district (Curry and Roosevelt Counties)
May use one (1) of the following:
 - Horse branded with owner's permanent Brand
 - Permanent Ownership Papers from NMLB (1-H) or Temporary Form (1)
 - Registration Papers in your name
 - Bill of sale written from previous owner to you with complete horse description – color, age, sex, markings, scars, brands

NMLB Supervisor prefers either your permanent brand on the horse or permanent ownership papers (1-H). If you have a horse that you raised or for some reason have no proof of ownership, call him at the number listed below and he will come to your house and inspect the horse there. This allows time to establish reasoning and create ownership papers.

- Any horse coming from out of district requires either a 1-H or a form 1 inspection.
- Permanent papers (1-H) are done at a cost of \$35 per head. These are good for the life of the horse or until you sell the horse.
- Any horse coming from out of state requires a Health Certificate and a current Coggins (not over 1 year old).

Additional detailed information available at the Extension Office and on our Face Book page – Horse Show Resources Roosevelt County Fair - clarifying the ownership paperwork needed for our horse show and link between horse and exhibitor. MUST have it for your entry to be complete.

Entry fee \$6 per class per horse. Late entries will not be accepted. Entry deadline is Friday, August 4 at 5:00 pm in the Extension Office. You may submit entries before this date.

GENERAL RULES and REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitor must be a resident of Roosevelt County and shall not have reached their 20th birthday by January 1st of current year. Special Needs Exhibitors must be a resident of Roosevelt County but age requirements are waived.
2. Age groups for points classes are:
Senior division 15-19;
Junior division 10-14;
Novice 9 and under – see number 3;
Special Needs Child or Adult – age waived – see number 4;
3. **All Novice Division classes will be walk/trot classes. A contestant in this division may move up to Junior Division if he/she is capable of loping their horse in a controlled fashion. Exhibitor must move up in ALL classes if choosing to lope (even Showmanship). MAY ONLY ENTER ONE AGE GROUP**
4. Special Needs Division: Eligibility for the Special Needs Division will be determined according to the label of “special needs” applying to mental or physical disabilities or circumstances that create an exceptional situation requiring individualized educational programs, physical accessibility or primary care requirements. All classes in this division are walk only.
5. Horses are not required to be registered. Ponies may be entered in any classes.
6. In the interest of promoting our horse show for Roosevelt County Youth, the exhibitor must have owned the horse 90 days or more prior to the show. If the exhibitor is not the owner of the horse, the horse will have been under the care of the exhibitor for 90 days or more prior to the fair. A fully completed Use Agreement will serve as the bridge between owner and exhibitor for ownership requirements if owner is not an immediate family member. 7. When submitting your entry for the show, it **MUST BE** accompanied by a copy of the ownership paperwork as required by the New Mexico Livestock Board as listed in the beginning of Youth Horse Show rules. Bear in mind, if the ownership document is a bill of sale, gift statement or lease/use agreement, it must contain the same descriptive information as found on other required documents. Some documents, such as registration papers and old NMLB permits, have information on both sides. Be sure to copy and submit **BOTH** sides.
8. **ONLY HORSES WITH A RECORD OF ENTRY** are allowed on the grounds. This keeps us in compliance with the other livestock divisions regarding exhibiting.
9. **DOGS** – Roosevelt County regulations require all dogs to be on leash.
10. Other than the Weanling Stallion/Gelding class, exhibitors may not show a stallion. **WEANLINGS ARE NOT CONSIDERED FOR GRAND OR RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIPS.**
11. Trail classes will be ridden by appointment. You may **NOT** school your horse over the trail course prior to competition. Before opening trail for judging, exhibitors will be able to walk over the course on foot with the judge. This is the time to ask questions.
12. Etiquette for the arena – When the Fair Queen, Princess or Sweetheart are exhibitors at the show they will not wear anything into the arena that identifies them as Fair Royalty. We know exhibitors are proud of their winnings but do not ride in a class with those ribbons on you or your horse.
13. Patterns for all classes will be posted by the judges prior to the class. Check with show office on the grounds for locations.

14. Judged by AQHA rules. Judges may alter the dress requirements at their discretion. Any questions may be directed to the Superintendent. To order a copy of AQHA Rule Book, call (806) 376-4811 or go to www.aqha.com. Special Needs Division judged according to Roosevelt County Fair Horse Show Supplemental Information.
15. No horses will stall at the fair.
16. Yearling Prospect Class: Please refer to that section for more details. Numbers 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11 and 12 in General Rules apply to Yearling Prospect Class. **THIS CLASS, YEARLING PROSPECT, WILL BE DISCONTINUED IN 2018.**
17. Buckles for High Point Classes (#2411-2434) will be given in each division:
18. The following point system will be used for the points classes:
 - 6 points for 1st
 - 5 points for 2nd
 - 4 points for 3rd
 - 3 points for 4th
 - 2 points for 5th
 - 1 point for 6th

Any tie for high point in a division will be decided by the individual placing highest in Horsemanship.

POINTS WILL BE FIGURED BY THE FAIR OFFICE AFTER THE RESULTS ARE TURNED IN THURSDAY. You will be contacted Friday if you are a winner and need to be at the awards presentation.

POINTS STAY WITH HORSE AND RIDER COMBINATION

19. A break of at least 30 minutes will be taken between halter/showmanship and performance classes. The FUN CLASS will be held before break begins or after break ends – whatever will work best for schedule. During the break you may warm your horse up in the arena. SPEED LIMIT APPLIES OUTSIDE THE ARENA AT ALL TIMES – WALK ONLY. The Superintendent will arrange for pictures of Grand and Reserve Champions. If you leave the grounds for lunch and do not make it back when classes start, the class will NOT be held open for you.
20. **Water Glass Fun Class!** This class is open to all exhibitors entered in the Youth Horse Show. To enter, be sure to have a dollar when you arrive at the arena. You will be given a glass with a pre-measured amount of water in it. You may ride at a walk, trot and possibly extended trot, stop, back and reverse and keep the water in the glass. The class will be stopped periodically and water amounts measured until there is only one rider with the most water. That rider wins the jackpot consisting of all the dollar entry fees.

SAFETY: Any child/person riding or handling a horse outside the arena in a manner that is hazardous to self or another person or horse, will be asked, by authorized staff, to wait on foot in a location considered safe for all. This will be in effect for the remainder of this show. Failure to observe ‘walk only’ areas may also result in rider waiting out classes on foot. Authorized Staff are those wearing green staff badges.

HALTER DIVISION – no stallions other than weanling

- 2401 Kid Pony - Lead in Halter - Class (for ages 9 and under only). Ponies must be 52” and under. Will be measured. Ribbons only. No premiums. Not a traditional halter class but a place for kids to start their show career. Blue ribbon class. Special Kid Pony Attitude LEROY Award - Horse Show staff chooses the pony they think best demonstrates a good attitude and interactions with their child in and out of the arena.
- 2402 Weanling Stallion/gelding – current year foal – not eligible for Grand Champion – may enter on mare’s ownership paperwork
- 2403 Yearling Gelding – required to enter on own ownership paperwork
- 2404 Junior Gelding – five years old and younger
- 2405 Aged Gelding – over five years old

- 2406 Weaning Filly – current year foal – not eligible for Grand Champion
– may enter on mare’s ownership paperwork
- 2407 Yearling Filly - required to enter on own ownership paperwork
- 2408 Junior Mares – five years old and younger
- 2409 Aged Mares – over five years
- 2410 Yearling Prospect Class – If shown previous year on mare’s papers must have own
this year. **THIS CLASS DISCONTINUED EFFECTIVE 2018.**

POINTS DIVISION – Except trail, all classes will be ridden in the arena.

- 2411 Showmanship at Halter – novice
- 2412 Showmanship at Halter – junior
- 2413 Showmanship at Halter – senior
- 2414 Lead-line – a non-point class - *may not enter any other class 14-34*
- 2415 Western Pleasure—special needs – (walk only)
- 2416 Western Pleasure—novice (walk/trot only)
- 2417 Western Pleasure—junior
- 2418 Western Pleasure—senior
- 2419 Horsemanship—special needs - (walk only)
- 2420 Horsemanship—novice (walk/trot only)

- 2424 Barrels—novice (walk/trot only)
- 2425 Barrels—junior
- 2426 Barrels—senior

YEARLING PROSPECT CLASS DISCONTINUED EFFECTIVE 2018

Yearling Prospect Class for geldings and fillies - Rules and Regulations

1. All horses shown the year before at the Youth Horse Show as a weanling will qualify for the Prospect Show the following year and will be exempt from an entry fee. A late fee of \$100 is to be paid if a yearling was not shown the previous year and still wants to enter the Yearling Prospect Class.
2. Ownership requirements as stated in the "General Rules and Regulations" apply. They Prospects must come in to this class on their own papers.
3. At the time entry is made, submit a short statement that tells about the training the horse has received and what you feel the horse is capable of. Turn in a copy of your statement when you turn in your entry. Be sure it has your name and horse's name on it.
4. Horses will be judged as halter and showmanship combined and will also complete designated obstacles. All three elements will be scored. This may be two separate classes or one combined class at the discretion of the superintendent.
5. All geldings and fillies will be shown together. No Stallions.
